Nursery

All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents! Please bring diapers and any snacks, formula as needed for your child.



Holy Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread, dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

Top Ten Wind Energy Stories of 2011

Okay, so this list might never make the David Letterman show, but it is a very, very important story to tell! The American Wind Energy Association (AWEA) reported a number of major milestones in the United States for 2011. The AWEA posted the top 10 wind energy stories of 2011, mentioning that the industry achieved many milestones through the year. California made the list at number four with its landmark RES that will up the state's renewable electricity standard from its current 20 percent to an historic 33 percent by 2020. The list also mentions that wind power hit 20 percent overall in Iowa and South Dakota, while it contributed a record 50 percent for a period of time in Colorado. Another top-10 story was the cost drop of 33 percent for wind turbines! But, hey, where is any mention of Virginia in these stats? Perhaps, as renewable energy sources become more mainstream, Virginia will begin to move up the list in ranking! It is well known that coal-fired power plants are not clean, are not good for the environment, and are definitely not renewable. It's time Virginia's energy needs moved away from fossil fuels to renewables.
