## Nursery

All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents! Please bring diapers and any snacks, formula as needed for your child.



## Holy Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread, dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

## Did

St. Timothy's now has single-stream recycling!! What is single stream recycling? Well, it is definitely NOT recycling by placing all of our trash into the single stream behind our house (just a little bit of "steward of creation" humor here!). Instead, it is the buzz word used by the industry noting that all items that are recyclable can now be placed in one bin for removal by St. Timothy's trash hauling company! Have the rules for recycling changed? Yes, but for the better!! Now, St. Tim's can recycle much, much more. Please RINSE & RECYCLE all plastics coded no. 1 through no. 7, , all cans (tin, steel, aluminum (foil too!)), and all glass bottles and jars. Recycle all paper (non-food stained) but keep white paper separate because it has a greater value over mixed paper! REMEMBER -- NO plastics without a code (e.g., NO creamer cups, plastic utensils, straws, etc.), NO glassware, plate glass or heat-resistant glass, NO ceramics, NO batteries, NO styrofoam, NO light bulbs, NO food-stained napkins, paper or cardboard.
