A Reading from the First letter of John.

We declare to you what was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—this life was revealed, and we have seen it and testify to it, and declare to you the eternal life that was with the Father and was revealed to us—we declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light and in him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us. My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

Gospel John 20:19-31

Celebrant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with

you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

The Beginning of the Journey to Adulthood

A Celebration and Blessing of Manhood and Womanhood

Brad: Dear People of God, today, we celebrate one of God's great gifts --- the gift of manhood and womanhood. The celebrities will now be presented.

Teachers and celebrities stand.

Teachers (alternating with each person): We present to you NN.

Each celebrity walks up to the altar rail as his/her name is called, facing the altar. Teachers sit after the last celebrity is presented.

Leslie: By the grace of God, you have lived through the pains and joys of childhood and have grown strong. Now, as women and men, it is given to you to share in God's power of creation. You are blessed with the ability to create new ideas, new thoughts, new hopes for the world, and indeed, even to create new life. Because we are made in God's image, we are the only creatures on Earth who can choose how to use our creative power --- to shape the world according to God's purpose. God calls us to use this gift to build, and not to destroy. *Are you aware of God's gift to you, and the responsibility to use it wisely?*

Celebrities: I am!

Leslie: Let us join these young people in reading Psalm 139, with the congregation repeating the Antiphon.

John M (lector): Lord, you have searched me out and known me;

You know my sitting down and my rising up; You discern my thoughts from afar. If I take the wings of the morning,

and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,

even there, Your hand will lead me and Your right hand hold me fast.

Congregation: Your works are wonderful, and I know it well!

John M (lector): For You Yourself created my inmost parts;

You knit me together in my mother's womb.

I will thank You because I am marvelously made!!

Your works are wonderful, and I know it well!

Congregation: Your works are wonderful, and I know it well!

John M (lector): My body was not hidden from You while I was being made in secret and

woven in the depths of the Earth.

Your eyes beheld my limbs, yet unfinished in the womb;

All of them were written in Your Book; they were fashioned day by day,

when as yet, there were none of them.

Congregation: Your works are wonderful, and I know it well!

John M (lector): Search me out, O God, and know my heart.

Try me, and know my restless thoughts.

Look well, whether there be any wickedness in me, and lead me in the

way that is everlasting.

Congregation: Your works are wonderful, and I know it well!

All stand. Celebrities step up to the kneelers. Parents walk up to the chancel, standing behind their sons/daughters.

Leslie: When Mary and Joseph searched for Jesus and found Him in the Temple talking with the elders, they realized that Jesus was no longer a child. This is such a moment. We rejoice with you as we recognize your sons and daughters as young men and young women. We stand with you to support you as they begin their journey to adulthood.

Brad: People of God, together, let us pray for these parents.

Ministers and Congregation: God of mercy and love, enfold these parents with Your grace. Increase in them the spirit of wisdom and understanding. Teach them how to truly listen with a spirit of love, patience, and gentleness. Bless these parents as they watch their sons and daughters enter into manhood and womanhood. Strengthen and uphold them as they comfort their sons and daughters, remembering that they can neither walk the journey for them, nor shield them from pain. Carry them safely through this journey, so that one day, they may stand together as adults and friends. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, AMEN.

Leslie: The congregation may be seated, but we ask the parents to remain standing. Parents, you may now pledge to your sons and daughters.

Celebrities turn to face the parents

Parents (alternating by sentence):

We now recognize your passage into manhood and womanhood.

We thank God for the gift of your lives.

As you begin to carve out the life that will be your own, we stand behind you and support you.

May we be patient and understanding, ready to guide and forgive, that in our love for you, you may know the love of God.

You are holy, wonderful and blessed, and we won't look away from you.

All Parents: We are your parents, and we support you on this journey!

Parents return to their seats, and may be seated.

Leslie: As the living body of Christ, we have been empowered by the Holy Spirit to do God's work in the world. Will you, as a community of faith which spans the generations, share your knowledge, experience, and love with these young people as they begin their journey into adulthood?

Congregation: We will, with God's help! We recognize you as young men and women of St. Timothy's Church. We stand behind you on your journey. You are formed by a loving Hand and are unique expressions of the creative power of God. God is with you! God is calling you! Explore, ask, claim, and embrace! You are holy, wonderful, and blessed, and we won't look away from you. We are your community of faith, and we support you on this journey.

Celebrities then step down from the kneelers, and turn to face the altar.

Brad (to all celebrities together): Brothers and sisters, you have been armed by Almighty God with both the imagination of childhood and the strength and creative power of manhood and womanhood. Now, you must journey forth to gain the skills you will need to assume full responsibility as an adult.

Brad (to each individual celebrity as he makes the sign of the Cross on the forehead): N, may Almighty God fill you with courage, wisdom, and joy. May Jesus Christ, your strong and neverfailing Friend, make you strong in faith and defend you on every side. May the Holy Spirit guide you in truth and peace. And may the blessing of God Almighty, Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer, rest upon you this day and evermore.

Congregation (as each celebrity is blessed): Amen!

After the last celebrity is blessed, celebrities then turn to face their peers in the left-hand pews. Peers stand.

Leslie: Dear friends and fellow journeyers, as these young people move beyond the circle of their families, they will need loyal friends. They will need your advice, your encouragement, and your acceptance. Will you be there for them and be their friends, knowing that there will be times when your support means more to them than any other?

J2Aers and other Rite 13s (alternating by sentence):

We will, with God's help!

We will support you in the ways that we are able, and we offer you our friendship.

You are holy, wonderful, and blessed, and we won't look away from you.

We are your peers, and we support you on this journey.

J2Aers and other Rite 13s (in unison): We welcome you! Come join us! Celebrities go to the left-hand pews to sit with their peers for the rest of the service. Then, all stand for the Peace.

Brad (after celebrities have joined their peers in the left-hand pews): As one Church together, may the peace of the Lord be always with you!

Congregation: And also with you!

By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising

to life again he has won for us everlasting life. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Please remain standing or kneel as you are able.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you.
