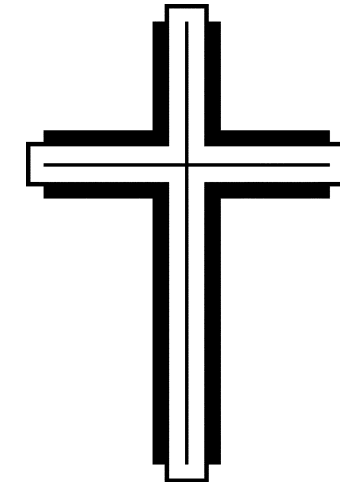

Nursery

All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-2.5 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents! please bring diapers and any snacks, formula as needed for your child.



Holy Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread, dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

LINK Food Delivery

LINK, an all volunteer organization, has been serving the Herndon, Sterling, and Ashburn community since 1972. We are a group of churches of various backgrounds who find common ground in Matthew 25:35 – “For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me.” If you have food in your stomach, somehow the pains and uncertainty in life can be managed. Summer is typically a time where families have an increased need for food because children are home from school and there are no more subsidized lunches. LINK delivers food Tuesdays – Saturdays all year long. Weekday deliveries are typically done after 6 pm and Saturday deliveries are made between 1 – 4 pm. St. Tim's To Offer An Additional EfM Opportunity

Beginning in September with a school-year schedule, EfM (Education for Ministry) will meet weekly in the evening and/or on the weekend as the participants may decide. Keith Nelsen Stroud and Tim Lally will be co-mentoring the group. EfM provides an education by offering an opportunity to discover how we may respond to our call to Christian service. The seminar group is the nucleus of the program. Through study, prayer, and reflection, the EfM group moves toward a new understanding of the fullness of God's kingdom. Participants are given weekly reading assignments and with the help of resource guides are responsible for setting their own learning goals. In-class discussion and guided reflection provides us with an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the reading materials. More important is the development of skills in theological reflection. The goal is to learn to think theologically. By examining our own beliefs and our relationship to our culture and to the traditions of our Christian faith, participants can learn what it means to be effective ministers in the world. The seminar is supported by a life of prayer and regular worship. St. Tim's currently offers EfM with a calendar year schedule that meets on Tuesday morning and is co-mentored by Janet Koch and Rebecca Page. EfM groups do not meet in the summer.
