Today is Welcome Home Sunday!

Today we celebrate the start of a new school year at St. Timothy's with a barbecue picnic after the 11:00 a.m. service. Hamburgers, hot dogs, and cold drinks will be served. A Moon Bounce and other activities for children are arranged. Please join us to meet old and new friends in the church family. Everyone is welcome whether you have previously signed up or not. We would love to see you and hear about your summer and future plans.

All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the



Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents, please bring diapers, any snacks, and formula as needed for your child.

Holy Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread, dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

Chesapeake Bay Foundation Staff to Speak at the SoCC Agriculture Conference.

Since 2000, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation has published reports on the health of the Chesapeake Bay. The indexes assess types of environmental degradation that may be mitigated by various means: through improved farming practices, better management of soil erosion and fertilizer inputs, buffering of streams to limit pollution by livestock; through mitigation of residential impacts, better management of storm water, better treatment of wastewater; through interventions in the Bay itself, oyster gardening, planting of underwater grasses, and through other means. The panel will discuss steps taken by the CBF and the Virginia Marine Resource Commission to restore and protect bay health through oyster cultivation and other work with farmers, homeowners, schools, municipal governments and others to promote other changes necessary to alleviate the human impact on the ecology of the Chesapeake Bay.
