We have the Annual Parish Retreat May 5-7 at Shrine Mont, our Diocesan Camp and Conference Center in Orkney Springs, Virginia. ing a small team of adults to Pine Ridge every year for many years and have established very important friendships with the Lakota people. We learn a lot from them, and hope we contribute something in return. Their heritage, traditions, and spirituality enrich our lives.

Our Church family member Natividad Menjivar will complete his Anglican Studies at Virginia Theological Seminary on May 17, Ascension Day! He will be "Received" as an Episcopal Priest in a service at St. Timothy's (date TBD), and will serve as God and our Bishop discern. We hope and pray he will remain in Herndon at St. Timothy's!

Voce will perform in our Sanctuary on May 18th at 7:30 pm. "The premier Vocal Chamber Ensemble in the Metro Dc area" according to The Washington Post, this magnificent a cappella group rehearses in St. Timothy's Sanctuary on Monday evenings and offers three concerts per year. Tickets are available at the door or on-line at <u>http://</u> <u>www.voce.org/tickets.php</u>. It is a great blessing to have these wonderfully gifted vocalists rehearse and perform at St. Tim's.

We will have a Silent Auction to raise funds for a new pipe organ, to reconfigure our choir area, and improve the resonance of our sanctuary. We can bid on-line beginning May 12th (go to www.sainttimothys.org and click on the link after May 7) and in our parish hall on May 20th. Our beloved Tracker Organ is 150 years old and ailing. Professional organ builders have told us it would cost as much to restore the "Tracker" as it would to purchase a new and more versatile pipe organ. And the sound quality will improve quite dramatically.

We also have three Holy Eucharist services every Sunday all year long (8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:00 am), Holy Day services, a Wednesday Healing and Holy Eucharist at 12:15 pm, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, prayer services in Spanish, Quinceneras celebrations, Weddings and Baptisms in Spanish, Journey to Adulthood and Rite 13, Godly Play, Newcomer Receptions, an annual Ministry Day, field

site experience and supervision for Seminarians, a Lay Committee for Seminarians, Preschool classes, Education for Ministry, more than two dozen Recovery meetings every week, Nurturing Parent Classes, Bible studies, a shawl ministry, Boy Scouts, piano and voice lessons, choir rehearsals, violin lessons and recitals, men's breakfasts, the annual Episcopal Church Women's retreat, Tai Chi, Zumba, Vestry meetings, finance meetings, Stephen Ministry, our ministry to marginal and homeless neighbors, math tutoring, youth ministries, our annual youth mission to Dungannon (which is in the poorest county in Virginia), our annual mission to Haiti (the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere) spiritual counseling, Altar and Flower Guild, Wee Got the Beat, Freedom from Debt, and Christian Education programs for all ages and stages!

It is rare to find our facilities empty. Next to the people of St. Timothy's, our buildings and grounds are our greatest tool for sharing and spreading the love of God. Thank you for your support! +

Congregation Q&A Q. What's a Suffragan Bishop? And why do we have three bishops?

A. The Diocese of Virginia is the largest diocese in the Episcopal Church in the United States. To serve so many people, we have three bishops: a diocesan bishop, an assistant bishop, and a suffragan bishop. A suffragan bishop is elected by a diocese to assist the diocesan bishop - but this is different from an assistant bishop. An assistant bishop is an already-consecrated bishop appointed to serve a diocese, often for a specified period of time. Our assistant is The Rt. Rev. Edwin F. "Ted" Gulick Jr. The suffragan bishop is a priest elected to the position of bishop, who assists the diocesan bishop. The diocesan bishop is the ecclesiastical authority in a diocese, elected by the diocese to serve until he or she retires or dies. Neither an assistant nor a suffragan has the right of succession, though. A bishop coadjutor is elected to succeed a diocesan bishop and traditionally assists the diocesan bishop for a specified period of time before being installed as the bishop.

St. Tims Delegates Elect New Suffragan Bishop

On Saturday, April 21 at St. George's in Fredericksburg, Virginia, our clergy (Leslie Chadwick and Brad Rundlett), along with delegates Betsy Knoizen, Jennifer Boysko, and Diane Miller, participated in the election of new Suffragan Bishop The Rev. Canon Susan E. Goff. Goff was elected on the fourth ballot, with 148 votes in the clerical order and 164 votes in the lay order. An election required 104 votes in the clerical order and 130 votes in the lay order. The consecration will occur on July 28, 2012 with the Most Rev. Katharine Jefferts Schori, presiding bishop, at St. Paul's, Richmond. A suffragan is a bishop elected by a diocese to assist the diocesan bishop.
