Some creatures aestivate (sleep through the summer; the opposite of hibernate). St. Timothy's operates all year round with three services every Sunday (8:00 am, 9:30 am, and 11:00 am) and one service every Wednesday (12:15 pm), plus a Latino prayer service Saturday nights (7:00 pm). We have a summer choir. We offer other Sacramental services as needed (Baptism, Marriage, Burial, etc.). The office is open Monday through Thursday. We have Godly Play on Sunday mornings. We continue to feed people who can't afford to buy all of the food they need, and help with other critical requirements. We send approximately 30 young adults (with adults) to work in Dungannon, which is in the poorest county in Virginia. Almost all of the groups and ministries will continue to meet. We don't close; we don't reduce our services or ministries. Our spiritual needs don't take a holiday. Our neighbors needs don't take a summer break. We feed our souls and serve our neighbors all year round, day by day.

Natividad ("Naty") Menjivar has finished Seminary and has been approved by the Standing Committee of the Diocese to be Received as an Episcopal Priest. He is finishing his Canonical Exams this week and then a date will be set for his Reception – which we hope will be at St. Timothy's. While Naty was studying in seminary Anna was working on her citizenship, which she now has. So, congratulations to Anna too!

Lila Dubishar, and Natalie Dubishar. Fr. Brad spoke of his experiences in Haiti as did Michelin and Wisnel. The event highlighted how special we feel when we are in our own clothes—the same feeling of pride and accomplishment the children of Chapateau feel in their school uniforms provided by St. Timothy's. People moved by the stories donated funds to St. Timothy's totalling over \$900.

On Sunday Michelin gave the sermon and Wisnel celebrated Eucharist at all three services. That evening, 77 people attended the Hope for Haiti reception and dinner to hear Michelin and Wisnel speak. Michelin spoke about the fate of children who don't attend school, who literally scrape out a living digging

and then pounding rock into pebbles to sell for construction, or who fish for subsistance on Lake Peligre. Wisnel shared the unique difficulties he faces in Miragoane, where cisterns hold all the water the people have during the dry season. Two of those cisterns cracked in the earthquake, and have not been repaired. Teenage girls often leave his mountain village in search of work, and return pregnant, barely able to care for themselves and their infants. The dinner raised more than \$4,000 for Wisnel and Michelin.

Congregation Q&A

Q. Why are Chris and Cheryl [Brock] are now wearing purple robes, and Jane [Perry] and Michael [Cook] wearing black?

A. Last month Chris and Cheryl Brock became Vergers. Vergers wear special robes and carry a staff (called the virge). The role of Verger dates back to the 12th century. Historically, Vergers were responsible for the order and upkeep of the house of worship, including the care of the church buildings, its furnishings, and sacred relics, preparations for liturgy, conduct of the laity, and grave-digging responsibilities; also, a verger might have needed to use his virge to keep back animals or an overenthusiastic crowd from the personage he was escorting, or to discipline unruly choristers. Today our Vergers keep the service running smoothly, ensuring everything and everyone is in place each service Sunday morning. Jane Perry and Michael Cook are now Senior Vergers, and thus wear black Verger robes.
