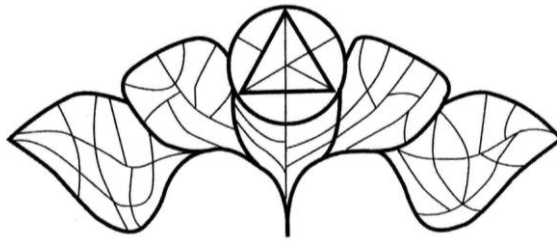

The Holy Eucharist

Celebrant: God be with you.

All: *And also with you.*

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

All: *We lift them to the Lord.*

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

All: *It is right to give God thanks and praise.*

Leader: We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of abundant life. Before there was anything your Spirit moved through the void and brought everything into being: the sun, moon, and stars; the earth, winds, and waters; and every living creature. You made people in your image, and taught us to live according to your ways. But we rebelled, and wandered away from you. And yet, as a mother cares for her children, you would not forget us. Time and time again you called us to live in your love. And so tonight we join with Saints and Angels in the chorus of praise that rings through Heaven, raising our voices to extol you we say:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, who conceived and bore your son Jesus, your holy child. He lived with us and loved us. He shared bread with outcasts and sinners.

He healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw the whole world into his loving embrace, but we refused. Then the time came for him to sacrifice himself in love on the cross, and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus sat at a table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to them, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. Again, he gave thanks to you, gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Now gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ – incarnate, crucified and risen - who was, who is, and who will come again, we offer you these gifts of bread and wine. And we offer ourselves as well, a living gift of love.

Pour your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Send your Spirit out into the whole earth and make us your new creation, the heart and hands of Christ for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us, with all your saints, from every tribe and language, people and nation, to feast at the banquet prepared from the foundation of the world. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. ***AMEN!***
