



Information For Our First Time Guests



All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child

brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents, please bring diapers, any snacks, and formula as needed for your child.



All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice

when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread, dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' "

The Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 12:3b-13

No one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. Fugue in E-flat BWV 552

Johann Sebastian Bach

Notes about the Music from Filippa Duke

The Fugue in E-flat (BWV 552b) was one of only a handful of pieces that Bach saw published in his lifetime. In 1739, the third book of the *Clavier-übung* (Keyboard Practice) was published. This work is widely thought to contain some of the most complex music for organ ever written. It is sometimes called the *German Organ Mass* because the movements in the collection are well-known sections of the Mass (Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, etc.) and it is bookended with the Prelude and Fugue in E-Flat. This is one of the few preludes and fugues that scholars know were actually intended to be played as a pair!

Many scholars talk about musical symbolism in Bach's work, and this fugue is one of the clearest examples of Bach's true genius- his ability to weave theological ideas into the fabric of amazingly complex and beautiful music. The fugue in E-Flat is rife with symbolism of the number three, which depicts the Holy Trinity. For example, the piece's key signature, E-flat, contains three flats. Additionally, the fugue is a triple fugue, meaning there are three different fugue subjects, or themes, that have their own character and are eventually woven together. The first fugue represents the Father, and is a solemn, stately fugue in the Stile Antico (Old Style) of composition. This fugue represents the majesty and timelessness of God, the Father. (It also sounds remarkably like today's final hymn, "O God, Our Help in Ages Past" sung to the tune St. Anne, thus it has been called the "St. Anne Fugue".) The second fugue has a running figure with a chiastic (cross-shaped) shape when notated and represents God, the Son. The final fugue is a dance form that symbolizes the dance of the Holy Spirit. The dance form was a forward looking compositional technique and shows Bach's mastery of newer types of styles. In the final moments of the piece, all three of the fugue subjects are combined to show how God, the Spirit, combines all three natures into one God.

Another interesting, yet more obscure, fact, is that the first fugue has 36 measures, the second has 45 and the final has 36. The length of these three sections has been linked to the Golden section, or "proportio divina." This ratio is a pleasing ratio found throughout art, architecture and nature.

After each piece Bach wrote, he noted "SDG JSB" (Soli deo gloria Johann Sebastian Bach) which is translated, "For the glory of God, Johann Sebastian Bach). Each time, I play Bach, I am reminded of his famous quote, "Where there is devotional music, God with His grace is always present." May it be so this Pentecost Sunday!


