If you are new to St. Timothy's, Father Mark Michael, our Interim Rector, would love for you to introduce yourself to him after the service. He will be outside (weather permitting). You may also write your name and address on one of the pew cards and put it in the offering basin, or sign the newcomer's book under the cross in the Narthex. We would like to have this information so we can thank you for worshiping with us. We have a Christmas gift for you, a copy of "The Case for Christmas," a book by journalist Lee Strobel that explores the true identity of the child in the manger and the difference he makes for all of us. Pick up your book at the back of the church on the way out.

The Nicene Creed






