# Information For Our First Time Guests



All children are welcome to stay with parents in the Sanctuary during worship. However, for parents of children ages 0-3 years who want nursery care, we have a well-equipped and professionally-staffed nursery at the end of the hall nearest the Sanctuary. Each child brought to the nursery is given a number; only the parents of the child can take the child from the nursery. If a parent is needed during worship, the child's number will appear (in

red LED's) on the black panels beneath the hymn boards on both sides of the Chancel. Parents, please bring diapers, any snacks, and formula as needed for your child.



All baptized Christians are welcome to receive the Sacrament. If you have not been baptized, please come to the Altar rail for a blessing during Holy Communion (place your arms across your chest to signify your desire for a blessing). If you would like to be baptized, please speak with the clergy after the service. To receive Holy Communion, accept the bread in your hand and place it in your mouth, then sip wine from the Chalice when it is brought to you (guide the Chalice to your mouth please), or hold the bread,

dip it in the wine when the chalice comes to you, and place the bread with wine in your mouth. If you are allergic to wheat or are gluten intolerant, please let the person serving bread know to give you a rice wafer.





Celebrant and People Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.



# Rector Search Committee (RSC) Update

The RSC wants to make every effort to keep you informed about what we're doing and what we've accomplished. In the five months since we were commissioned, the RSC has met almost weekly to determine what the congregation does and doesn't want in a new rector, held six Focus Groups, held a Timeline Event in which the entire congregation participated, and one or more RSC reps have attended monthly Vestry meetings. RSC reps have also met with the Stewardship and Finance Committees, the Latino Ministry, the Director of Christian Ed and collaborated with the church webmaster on revising and expanding the church website.

Throughout the summer and into fall, the RSC will continue holding Focus Groups in order to hear from as many congregants as possible. Additionally, we have begun work on a parish-wide survey that will be distributed in early fall.

The RSC is acutely aware of how much we want to call a new rector. We also understand that person must be the right fit for this church and we want to do the best job possible in selecting him or her.
