## From the Bridge Interim Rector Anne Turner

Dear friends in Christ,

As I write this letter, my eight months as your Bridge Interim Rector—or, as I have thought of it, your Interim Interim—is drawing to a close.

In my own life, this change marks the end of a professional chapter. It has been a time of profound growth for me. I've learned about presiding in Spanish and what it means to have an organ refurbished, among other new experiences.

In the life of this parish, an even more significant chapter is ending. Your search committee and vestry are poised to call a new rector. With that person's arrival, the church will end a two-year period of transition. So much that has been in flux will be able, at last, to settle into a new normal.

Interim times can be difficult. They draw on all our resources, forcing us to adapt to all kinds of change, both planned and unforeseen. And yet interim times are also full of gifts. I want to be certain to name and celebrate those gifts.

Perhaps the most significant gift is a new understanding of identity. Most of us tend to think of our adult selves as settled. We have one way of being, and that way is the way we are. Parishes think of themselves as settled, too. But in an interim time, it is clear that we are dynamic creatures. We are not the people or community we have always thought. We have failings of which we were unaware; we have strengths we did not imagine. Put into a new context, the identities that seemed so familiar and reliable are shown to be elastic. We are more flexible than we ever imagined. And, I believe, we are stronger than we knew.



With that new understanding of our human identities comes a new understanding of God's identity. We don't know God as well as we thought. And that is, in the end, good news. With each crisis there is a new opportunity to learn how far God's grace extends. With each challenge, there is a new chance to trust God. I am guessing that for each of you reading this letter, God seems different than two years ago. God is larger than we ever thought.

You have done much, in these eight months, to enlarge my understanding of God. Working alongside members of this parish—and with our incredibly talented and dedicated staff—has been a great gift. I am grateful to God for this time, and I wish you all every blessing in the time ahead.

#### VESTRY REPORT

June 2017

May Giving: **\$49,457** Budgeted Giving: \$54,244

YTD Expenses vs. Income: \$10,156

At the June 26 Vestry meeting, the Vestry heard a report from the Rector Search Committee. The Diocese has been performing Oxford background checks on the finalist candidates, and the RSC met recently to determine their final recommendation. Upon selecting a finalist, the following steps take place prior to the announcement of our new Rector:

- The RSC notifies the Diocese of their selection
- Assuming a satisfactory outcome on the background check, the Bishop arranges a conference with the candidate
- The Bishop approves the candidate
- The name of the candidate is given to the Vestry
- The Vestry meets the candidate
- The Vestry approves the candidate
- The Vestry negotiates a Letter of Agreement
- The new Rector is announced to the congregation

The Vestry spent the bulk of the remaining meeting on the mid-year budget review. Treasurer Jean Shepherd noted that giving is proceeding in line with last year's giving between January and May, but expenses are higher than last year, resulting in a projected \$60,000 deficit by the end of the year.

St. Timothy's will incur un-budgeted expenses resulting from the calling of a new Rector: the finalist candidates have greater years of experience than our budgeted compensation takes into account, and all candidates will require moving expenses, resulting in approximately \$20,000 in additional unbudgeted staff expenses this year.

After discussion, the Vestry voted to defer the remainder of our Diocesan pledge for the year until December, when it will re-assess our cash flow and remaining General Fund balance to determine if we can fulfill our pledge. The Vestry voted to increase

new Rector compensation to Diocesan minimums for a priest with more than 20 years of experience, to \$105,000, and to allocate up to \$15,000 for moving expenses. The Vestry liaisons will request to each of their ministries and to all staff to hold off on incurring any discretionary or non-vital expenses during the summer.

The Vestry then voted to accept Treasurer Jean Shepherd's resignation effective July 1, and to elect Duane Hartge to serve the remainder of her term, until January 2019.

Bridge Interim Rector Anne Turner reported that the Rev. Jackie Thomson will cover the four weeks from July 16 - August 6 and could potentially be available longer if needed. Seminarian Bill Baker will continue to conduct Saturday evening worship through August 26. The preschool usage agreement has not been reviewed or updated in more than 10 years, and she is in the process of working on that with Preschool Director Monica Despins. She hopes to wrap up the preschool use agreement renegotiation prior to her departure.
