St. Tim's During the Week

There's the St. Timothy's most of us experience on Sunday mornings—members of our Church family assembled for beautiful worship, young people and children in Sunday school coming in during the Peace, Baptisms and Holy Communion, lovely and inspirational music, readings from Scripture, a thoughtful and thought-provoking sermon, time to pray, offering some of our financial resources for the ministries and missions of the church, and refreshments after services.

Then there's the St. Timothy's that most of us don't see beautiful children from all over the world coming to our Preschool; people from our community coming here for help with rent, food, prescriptions, or just the feeling of welcome and compassion that's not often found elsewhere. Voce rehearses on Monday evenings in the Sanctuary while the Boy Scouts meet in Henry Hall, the Vestry (fourth Mondays) meets in room B1, and people who suffer with the disease of addiction come to recovery meetings (we have two dozen meetings every week in rooms all over the church!).

We host Nurturing Parent classes on Tuesday evenings. There, mentors work with parents for twelve weeks, train-

ing them, having them practice effective parenting skills. Our Stephen Ministers are here too in peer supervision.

On Wednesdays we have a morning Bible study, "Wee got the beat" for little children, a 12:15 pm healing and Holy Eucharist service, math tutoring, and the shawl ministers knitting shawls, baby blankets, and afghans.

There's Tai Chi on Thursdays, Zumba (also on Tuesday), and Freedom from Debt.

On Fridays members of St. Timothy's fold Sunday programs, on Saturdays the Altar Guild sets up for Sunday services, there are violin lessons, and an evening prayer service in Spanish.

Of course throughout the week there are music lessons, choir rehearsals, and our Music Director practices for services, and our clergy and staff counsel, offer help with food (etc.) as do some wonderful volunteers. And our Sextons come in late at night, every night, to clean up and lock up.

St. Timothy's is full of life night and day. +

Join General Convention to Lament the Doctrine of Discovery July 10

Papal Bulls of the 15th century gave Christian explorers the right to claim lands they "discovered" and lay claim to those lands for their Christian Monarchs. Any land that was not inhabited by Christians was available to be "discovered", claimed, and exploited. If the "pagan" inhabitants could be converted, they might be spared. If not, they could be enslaved or killed. The doctrine has been primarily used to support decisions invalidating or ignoring aboriginal possession of land in favor of colonial or post-colonial governments. This Doctrine governs United States Indian Law today and has been cited as recently as 2005 in the decision City Of Sherrill V. Oneida Indian Nation Of N.Y.

"In an unprecedented step of significance for Christian response to the European invasion and settlement of the Americas, the Episcopal Church is the first Christian denomination to publically repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery through the actions of D033 taken at GC 2009," explained Eagle Heart. "The Church demonstrated the courage of our convened leadership by offering the repudiation in 2009, and now in 2012 calls upon and invites all Episcopalians to join in a substantive response to the Doctrine of Discovery through participation in this lament to acknowledge, honor and respond compassionately to our grievous past of invasion and settlement." +
