On June 7th, the Bishop will be here for Pentecost Eve and our biennial Episcopal visit. **This service will take place on Saturday, at 7 pm, and will be the principal service for St. Timothy's that weekend. Haiti School Fund Update

THANK YOU TO ST. TIMOTHY'S FOR <u>PUTTING YOUR FAITH TO WORK</u> FOR OUR CHILDREN AT ST. MATHIEU'S SCHOOL IN CHAPOTEAU, HAITI

In mid-March we had a significant shortfall to our goal of raising \$27,500 for the Haiti School Fund. Teacher's salaries are about \$25,000 per year plus a 10% Partnership Program Fee (this money is used to fund the administration needed to ensure that proper accounting is maintained, and that the money reaches its intended recipients). The amount raised for this Agape is intended to carry us from 3/1/25 – 3/01/26. A <u>letter</u> to the congregation was sent on 3/27 explaining the situation. And, our very generous church family donated, not just the shortfall, but a cushion that will take us forward in 2026. As of this writing we have received \$29,540 year-to-date, and dispersed \$14,500 with another \$10,500 to be sent July 1st. This will fulfill our commitment for the calendar year.

Following the most recent disbursement on March 25th we received the following message from Pr. Kesner Gracia, head of the Partnership Program and the Priest-in-Charge for Chapoteau:

April 16, 2025

On behalf of the entire Chapoteau community, I would like to express our deepest gratitude. We have received the funds sent for the teachers' salaries - a precious and timely help in these difficult times. Your gesture takes on an even greater dimension, knowing that each of our teachers is now hosting one or more refugees in his or her own family.

My special thanks to you for your moral, spiritual and friendly support, which comforts and strengthens us. We are counting more than ever on your prayers. May God bless you abundantly and renew your strength.
