A Reading from Hebrews 12:18-29

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death.") Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken-- that is, created things-- so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we

are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.

Baptism

Presentation and Examination of the Candidate (BCP 301)

Celebrant: The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The candidate who is able to answer for herself is presented individually by her Sponsors,

Sponsors: I present Phoebe Zhen Zhen Ravenstahl to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When the candidate has been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors: I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidate who can speak for herself

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer: I renounce them.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer: I do.

After the candidate has been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Celebrant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in their life in Christ?

People: We will.

Celebrant: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Let us now pray for Phoebe who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Please stand, or kneel, as you are able.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.


Celebrant: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

FAITH FORMATION for ALL AGES – resumes AUGUST 24th

Sunday Adult Forums (in the Sanctuary during the 9 am hour, also livestreamed)

We begin with our 3rd Annual three-part series, taking its name from the famous church song: “I am the Church, You are the Church...”

Sunday August 24th: “You are the Church.” We will begin with our yearly Ecumenical Round Table (4.0!) featuring different members of our congregation sharing how they landed at St. Timothy’s Episcopal Church. This year’s is entitled “**Four Under Forty**” as a few of our younger members share their faith journey.

Sunday September 7th: “We are the Church.” In anticipation of our Shrine Mont Retreat next weekend, and the ongoing **100th Anniversary** of our Diocesan Camp and Conference Center, we will gather to watch a video on the Centennial Campaign “Living Stones” and hear from our own Diane Miller, Shrine Mont Board Member.

Sunday September 21st: “I am the Church.” In this final session, our “Senior” **Seminarian, Ellie Singer**, will share with us the story of her spiritual journey. Come to learn more about how Ellie’s life has been a witness and testimony of his faith!

Later this Fall: Join us for a 3 part series on the Gospel of Luke (Oct 26, and then Nov 2 and 9.) Come hear from Ron Boggio about how the 3rd Gospel comforts and challenges us in these trying times.

Sunday School

During the 10 AM Sunday Service, children and youth from 4th grade and up will gather first in the sanctuary, but then be shepherded by teachers out to meet at the outdoor chapel, weather permitting, where our kids will have time to gather, learn a bible story, and play on our beautiful church grounds. We will rejoin worship before communion. In case of inclement weather, we will gather in Henry Hall.

Godly Play

Finally, our children (age 3-3rd grade) will continue to attend Godly Play during the 10 AM Sunday Service. This Montessori-based curriculum uses hands-on storytelling and wondering to introduce children to Bible stories and church traditions. Children who attend Godly Play head downstairs after the reading of the Collect and then rejoin their parents in the Sanctuary during the Peace prior to Eucharist.
